

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

### Where, when, and how often does Lumina rehearse?

The Lumina Christmas Choral Project will rehearse and perform over two weekends in Paris: the weekends of 8-10 November and 28 November-1 December.

Specific rehearsal and performance times are as follows:

#### Rehearsal weekend: 8-9-10 November 2024

- Friday 8 November, 19h-21h30
- Saturday 9 November, 10h-13h and 15h-18h
- Sunday 10 November, 10h-13h and 15h-17h

#### Performance weekend: 29-30 November and 1 December 2024

- Friday 29 November, 19h-21h30 (rehearsal)
- Saturday 30 November, 11h-13h30 (rehearsal) and 17h call time for 20h performance (tentative)
- ➤ Sunday 1 December, 13h30 call time for 16h performance (confirmed)

<u>Singers</u> must be available for the entirety of these two weekends. Exceptions may be granted at the discretion of the director.

## What kind of preparation is expected?

Every member is expected to prepare the repertoire independently in the weeks leading up to the first rehearsal weekend. Members should arrive at the first rehearsal ready to focus on blending, vowel matching, interpretation, language diction, technique, musicality, etc. Rehearsals are not meant to learn notes and rhythms. Scores and practice tracks will be provided for each voice part in advance of the rehearsal weekends to ensure manageable independent preparation. Members based in Paris are at liberty to organize small group rehearsals or sectionals to refine their parts and gain confidence.

## What are the obligations for participants in the Lumina Christmas Project?

- 1. Payment of fees (to cover rehearsal and performance venues, noting that scholarships are available):
  - a. Paris-based members 125€
  - b. Out of town/students/unemployed 75€
- 2. Purchase of Concert dress
  - c. Women = black infinity dress ( $\sim$ 50€), black shoes
  - d. Men = black suit, black dress shirt, black shoes and socks
- 3. Volunteer participation in concert preparation (programs and marketing)
- 4. Respect for colleagues at all times

## What level are the singers?

Members have widely varied backgrounds and levels of experience as singers. We have members who are professional musicians as well as singers with basic reading skills.

## What is the ambiance of Lumina?

Our group ambiance is warm and friendly. We have students in their 20s all the way up to retirees. We are all volunteers, and we make a group effort towards excellence. We love singing together, making music together, and working towards a common goal.

## What kind of music does Lumina sing?

Ensemble Lumina sings diverse repertoire every season. We sing Baroque and Renaissance (Byrd, Lotti, Purcell, Tallis), music from the Baltic and Nordic countries (Augustinas, Esenvalds, Gjeilo, Makaroff, Pärt, Rise), Austro-German Romantic and Classical works (Brahms, Bruckner, Mendelssohn, Rheinberger, Wolf), traditional folk songs (Bulgarian, Estonian, Finnish, Irish, Scottish, American), French music (Debussy, Duraflé, Hindemith, Poulenc), contemporary works (Barnwell, Dan Forrest, Steven Foster, Fred Gramann, Ralph Manuel, Moses Hogan, Morten Lauridsen, Stephen Paulus, Jake Runestad, Eric Whitacre, Ryan Oldham) and more.
